





On a hot, steamy New York summer night in July of 1899, with the symbolic act of overturning a distribution wagon, thousands of corner newsboys and newsgirls went on strike against the two largest newspapers in the country, Joseph Pulitzer's New York World and William Randolph Hearst's New York Journal. Lasting approximately two weeks, mobs of these kids filled the streets of Manhattan and prevented circulation of the papers. The year prior, news about the Spanish-American War had increased sales of papers, and several publishers raised their prices

from 50¢ to 60¢ for a 100-paper newsie bundle. With the end of the war and the return to regular circulation rates, Pulitzer and Hearst were holdouts on returning to the pre-war prices.

Most newsies were orphans, runaways, homeless, or were children from poor immigrant families who sold papers in the mornings, afternoons and evenings to scrape together meager earnings for survival. They lived hard, often violent lives and were far from the plucky, spirited, and ambitious entrepreneurs often depicted. Nevertheless, this band of the city's poorest, scrappiest residents took on two of the country's most famous and wealthy men - and won! Most importantly, a bright light was focused on the child labor crisis in our country and the desperate need for reform.

Disney has taken these events and woven a story that is sure to inspire us all. It has been such a joy to navigate the tale of these newsies with this impressive cast of enthusiastic, talented, earnest, and disciplined ladies and gentlemen. *Newsies* is an incredibly demanding show that requires a tremendous amount of hard work. It's always the Director or Choreographer's job to say, "Let's do that one more time!" Usually that exclamation is followed by murmured groans and dramatic pleas for mercy. This cast is the exception to that rule. I can't wait for audiences to pour into the theatre and experience these performers as they dance, sing, and act their way into your hearts. "Seize the Day!" Fort Wayne, and join us as we take you on a journey back to 1899 with the real Kings of New York!



#### IN THE WINGS ARTS-IN-EDUCATION



Eunice Wadewitz Music/Education Director

According to the National Department of Education and the National Endowment for the Arts, "arts learning experiences can alter the attitudes of young people toward themselves and each other. For example, students involved in sustained theater arts (scene study, acting techniques, and dramatic or musical theater production) often show gains not only in reading proficiency, but also in self-control and motivation and in empathy and tolerance for others. Learning in and through the arts can even

help students overcome the obstacles of disadvantaged backgrounds." Businesses understand that arts education helps youth develop a positive work ethic and pride in a job well done, can help troubled youth by providing an alternative to destructive behavior, and aid youth to develop a sense of craftsmanship, quality task performance and goal-setting.

Children find that the theater can offer an emotional safe haven from family turmoil, that achievement in the art and friendships built during the show process embolden them as they enter new situations of various kinds, that their performances bring the broader community together in pride, that their horizons are expanded through trips to theaters outside of their immediate neighborhoods, and that they get a glimpse of the wide-ranging cultural world. All of this leads to a confidant, self-motivated youth, empowered with life skills that create a self-reliant person who is successful in school, work, and life. As adults, these same individuals become assets to their community, having learned and developed many skills which they need in order to live and work in a society, and are highly employable.

In short, the arts are as much a part of a child's development and success as they are a part of a successful and enlightened society.






