The Fort Wayne Civic Theatre is extremely honored to be collaborating with the Fort Wayne Parks & Recreation Department in bringing Legally Blonde to the Foellinger Outdoor Theatre. During this period of the coronavirus we were forced to think out-of-the-box on how to move forward, how to proceed in the safest way possible for all. The Foellinger Outdoor Theatre has given us this path to create and engage our audiences once again after having to cancel the last two shows of the 2019-2020 Season: A Cole Porter Celebration Concert and Noises Off. We are extremely disappointed for our actors, singers, production team, volunteers, and patrons that we could not produce these two shows.

In addition, FW Parks & Recreation Department has agreed to host the Civic Theatre's all-female musical production of 1776 at the Foellinger Outdoor Theatre as well. The open-air venue provides fresh air and plenty of space to accommodate social distancing seating. The capacity of the Foellinger Outdoor Theatre is normally 2,571, but with social distancing seating only 498. That is if Governor Holcomb moves to stage 5 of his reopening Indiana plan. If not, we will only be selling up to 250 seats. Whereas, the Civic Theatre's home stage at the Arts United Center's capacity is 630, but with social distancing seating only 160.

The point is that we are mission driven as a 501c3 non-profit arts organization. Since 1927, we have had a proud history of our vision, mission and values that drives our organization.




