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

#### DIRECTOR'S NOTES - BECKY NICCUM



Nostalgia. Who doesn't love it? And what's more nostalgic than the old Christmas movies? White Christmas was the most successful film of 1954 and it was the first film to be produced in VistaVision, a wide screen process, developed by Paramount Pictures The lasting popularity of the film led to the creation of the musical version in 2000, which we are presenting for the second time (and I have the pleasure of directing again) at the Civic Theatre.


White Christmas is a classic with a great mix of Irving Berlin songs that you'll find yourself singing as you leave the theatre. Some of Berlin's songs in the show were originally written for other projects and then subsequently cut from those shows and reworked to fit into White Christmas. The lyrics to "Snow" were changed to make it more appropriate for Christmas. It was initially titled "Free" and was going to be in Call Me Madam. "What Can You Do With a General?" was written for a show that was never produced called Stars On My Shoulders.

The holiday classic song "White Christmas" actually debuted in the movie *Irving Berlin's Holiday Inn* in 1942. Many people compare the film *White Christmas* to the 1942 film *Holiday Inn*. The same Columbia Inn set used in *Holiday Inn* was refurbished on the Paramount lot for the filming of *White Christmas* and both shows took place in fictional Pine Tree, Vermont.

We have gathered a very talented cast for this stage production and hope that you enjoy the show as much as we have enjoyed working on it. We have a few returning cast members from our 2010 production of *White Christmas*: Michael Nelaborige portrayed the dancing Phil Davis in 2010 and this time he will be playing the crooning Bob Wallace. Darby Bixler appeared before in the ensemble and for this production she will be showing her talents as the dancing/singing Judy Haynes. Scott Rumage reprises his role as Sheldrake and Dawn Yingling (2010 choreographer) is a featured dancer in this production. Joining us for this production are Chris Rasor as Phil Davis and Emily Arata Grillo as Betty Haynes along with many other talented cast members.

As the song in the show says, "Relax, Let Yourself Go" and come take a holiday walk down memory lane to Pine Tree, Vermont.

**BECKY NICCUM (Director)** is thrilled to be back directing at the Civic, her last show here being *Avenue Q* in 2016. Since then she has been busy at Arena Dinner Theatre; where she directed *The Cemetery Club* last Christmas and was in *They Came From Mars...*, which garnered her a supporting actress award. Some of her favorite roles have been Mazeppa in *Gypsy*, Rosemary in *Picnic* and Agnes Gooch in *Auntie Mame*. All three shows were at IPFW Theatre (PIT). Other favorite roles include Fairy Mae in *The Curious Savage*, Mortimer in *The Fantastics* and Haversham in *The Butler Did It*. These among many other shows were presented at Arena Theatre. Being a part of any facet of the theatre gives her such energy and enthusiasm, that she hopes spreads to everyone involved in the shows; as well as, the audience. She has truly enjoyed working with everyone involved with *White Christmas* and wishes them all to *BREAK-A-LEG!!!*

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

According to the National Department of Education and the National Endowment for the Arts, "arts learning experiences can alter the attitudes of young people toward themselves and each other. For example, students involved in sustained theater arts (scene study, acting techniques, and dramatic or musical theater production) often show gains not only in reading proficiency, but also in self-control and motivation and in empathy and tolerance for others. Learning in and through the arts can even

help students overcome the obstacles of disadvantaged backgrounds." Businesses understand that arts education helps youth develop a positive work ethic and pride in a job well done, can help troubled youth by providing an alternative to destructive behavior, and aid youth to develop a sense of craftsmanship, quality task performance and goal-setting.

Children find that the theater can offer an emotional safe haven from family turmoil, that achievement in the art and friendships built during the show process embolden them as they enter new situations of various kinds, that their performances bring the broader community together in pride, that their horizons are expanded through trips to theaters outside of their immediate neighborhoods, and that they get a glimpse of the wide-ranging cultural world. All of this leads to a confidant, self-motivated youth, empowered with life skills that create a self-reliant person who is successful in school, work, and life. As adults, these same individuals become assets to their community, having learned and developed many skills which they need in order to live and work in a society, and are highly employable.

In short, the arts are as much a part of a child's development and success as they are a part of a successful and enlightened society.

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





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
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
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
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# Meet the Fort Wayne Civic Theatre Staff
